**1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER**

Mayor Joyce called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

**2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The Stillwater City Council led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**3. PROCLAMATIONS/PRESENTATIONS**

- a. 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Payne County Health Department Children First – Scott Haywood, PIO, Regional Administrative Director Kelli Rader, & Children’s First Nurse Rachel Bryant

Mayor Joyce read the proclamation declaring April 2022 as Children’s First Program Appreciation Month. Scott Haywood, Payne County Health Department PIO, accepted the proclamation.

- b. Presentation by OK Association of Police Chiefs in recognition of officers from Stillwater Police Department and OK State University Police Department – Chief Louis Flowers & Steve Whitlock

Steve Whitlock, Executive Director of OK Association of Police Chiefs, stated that he and Chief Flowers feel it is important to come to the towns and communities to recognize the police officers for their heroic efforts.

Chief Louis Flowers, President of OK Association of Police Chiefs, presented OSU police officer Leslie Grotheer a Lifesaving Award for her efforts in saving a young person from jumping off a building.

Chief Flowers also presented two City of Stillwater police officers with awards. A Lifesaving Award was presented to Damian Neiswanger and a Medal of Valor was presented to Kurt Merrill for their efforts in saving a person from jumping off a building.

- e. Approve Stillwater History Museum at the Sheerar quarterly report.

Vice Mayor Zannotti stated that she wanted to recognize the Sheerar Museum for all the great work that the staff accomplishes with limited funding. She stated the museum receives \$15,000 annually from the City and that staff does a great job applying for grants and also keeping the City of Stillwater history alive inside the museum. Vice Mayor Zannotti also thanked the museum for the wonderful recognition they gave to the Mitchell family.

City Attorney Kimberly Carnley reported that City Code Enforcement and outside counsel Beth Anne Childs had not been able to make contact with the property owner but that the property owner was here tonight and she visited with her. Ms. Carnley stated that the property owner had contacted a realtor and plans to list the property for sale and she needs more time to get this accomplished. Ms. Carnley requested this hearing be tabled until the May 16, 2022 City Council meeting.

Receive public comment regarding a request from Grand Lake Mental Health Services for a Specific Use Permit to allow health care and social assistance on properties addressed at 1060 E Knotts Avenue (also addressed as 899 and 998 E Knotts Avenue and a portion of 801 E Lakeview) in the Commercial Shopping (CS) district and Residential Two and Multi Family (RTM) district

Chief Performance Innovation Officer Brady Moore reported that Grand Lake Mental Health, LLC is requesting a review and approval of a Specific Use Permit (SUP) to allow for a health care and social assistance facility at the property listed above. An SUP is required in the Commercial Shopping and Two-Family and Multi-Family Residential districts for the proposed use. The Future Land Use Map within the Comprehensive Plan indicates that the desired land use within this part of the community is High Density Residential.

Mayor Joyce opened the public hearing.

Josh Cantwell, Grand Lake Mental Health COO, stated that they are looking to build a certified behavioral health and substance abuse treatment center. The plan is to build a 36,000 square foot building to house all services that they provide in one location.

Lindsay Vallaster, 2021 N. Benjamin, stated she is concerned about the safety of the neighborhood, potential negative impact on property values and for the increased traffic problems this would add to an already strained traffic area. Ms. Vallaster asked about the possibility of a traffic study for this area.

Mayor Joyce closed the public hearing.

Planning Commission recommended approval of this SUP request 5-0.

## 8. GENERAL ORDERS

- a. Consider adjustments to the OkMRF vesting plan for general employees, approval of related joinder agreement, and adoption of amended OkMRF master plan

Deputy City Manager Melissa Reames reported that on February 28, 2022, staff presented an option to amend the current 10 year vesting schedule connected to the OkMRF defined contribution retirement plan to help with employee recruitment and retention. On March 28, 2022, staff proposed a change to the vesting schedule from the current 10 year program to a schedule that was within a three to seven year range. Ms. Reames stated that Council asked staff to return with a Voya transition plan to a lower vesting schedule with the associated documents needed to make the change. Voya needs a 90 day window to process the change in vesting schedule. OkMRF staff gave Voya notice on April 4, 2022 that the City of Stillwater was going to adopt a change to the current vesting schedule. This notice will allow the change to be effective July 1, 2022.

MOTION BY COUNCILOR HAWKINS, SECOND BY VICE MAYOR ZANNOTTI TO ADOPT A FIVE YEAR VESTING SCHEDULE WITH 20% VESTED EACH YEAR.

- c. Approve legal services agreement to retain Don Kiser to provide legal services as Bond Counsel in connection to the issuance of general obligation bonds by the City of Stillwater

City Attorney Kimberly Carnley stated that this is a legal services agreement to retain Don Kiser to serve as Bond Counsel for the City for the issuance of the GO bonds for the new fire station that was approved by the voters at the April 5 election. Bond Counsel serves in a specialized role as an attorney that is qualified and experienced in public transactions and among other things, drafts many of the documents utilized in the bond issue and will render an opinion as to the validity and enforceability of the obligations issued. Ms. Carnley stated that unlike other outside counsel that usually bills the City based on an hourly rate for work performed, Bond Counsel is unique in that they are only paid on a contingency basis after a successful election and the actual sale and issuance of bonds. Mr. Kiser has been integral to the fire station bond issue and with voter approval, the heavy work begins. As such, staff recommends approval of the legal services agreement.

Deputy City Manager Melissa Reames reported that at the March 28, 2022 City Council meeting, the proposed FY23 budget was presented that included action items needed during the current fiscal year (FY22) in order to balance the FY23 proposed budget. The action items are as follows:

1. Approve budget amendments totaling \$1.5 million to reduce budgeted operating expenditures in FY22. These are funds that department directors identified in their current budget that they anticipated not needing during the last quarter of the fiscal year and/or projects could be delayed.
2. Approve budget amendments totaling \$1.4 million to move a wastewater capital project from an undesignated funding source to a fund designated for wastewater expenditures.

- b. Resolution No. CC-2022-9: A resolution amending the City of Stillwater commercial cardboard collection rate structure and terms and conditions of collection

Waste Management Director Chris Knight reported that on March 21, 2022 discussion was held amongst the SUA Trustees and the decision was made to order 20 commercial recycling roll-off containers, which can be rented to general customers when not used for commercial cardboard recycling. The current commercial cardboard collection fee structure is not adequate. Staff recommends instituting a new cardboard collection fee structure provided by NewGen Strategies & Solutions, LLC. The new recommended fee structure is as follows:

- 20 cu. yd./open top \$195 monthly rental rate
- 30 cu. yd./open top \$225 monthly rental rate

Mr. Knight stated that staff recommends adopting Resolution No. CC-2022-9/SUA-2022-4 to amend the commercial cardboard collection rates.

Special Projects Director John McClenny presented the history of the rate study by Avant Energy that was completed in 2019. The electric rate escalator has been suspended since October 2018 and the water/wastewater rate escalator has been suspended since April 2019. Mr. McClenny reported that the rate recommendations from the Avant study are now outdated and the cumulative Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase since the last rate adjustment is 15.7%. Per the recent budget presentation, revenue projections are not keeping up with budget projections. Staff recommends reinstating the automatic rate escalators effective July 1, 2022. This will result in a 3% increase on

July 1, which is the minimum necessary to offset the negative growth in revenue as presented at the March 28 budget study session.
